

Qboard by QandR



With **Qboard**, you give your audience the opportunity to ask questions during your presentation — without interrupting your flow. While you're showing your slides, participants can submit live questions or comments about the slide currently on screen.

These questions remain hidden until you choose to open them via the **Qboard icon in the top right corner**. This way, you stay in control as the presenter: you decide whether to answer questions right away, address them later in your talk, or handle them at the end. 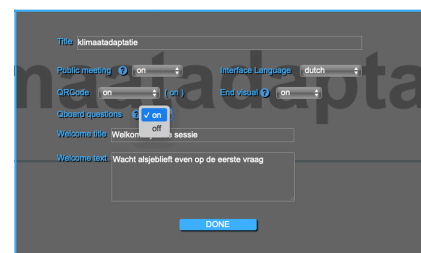
All submitted questions and comments are saved and later included in the PDF report with all visuals, as well as in the **Excel export** of your session.

How does it work in practice?

	
Participants <ul style="list-style-type: none">As soon as the presenter displays a slide, an input field automatically appears on the participant's phone.Through this field, they can immediately type a question or comment.Below the field are the <i>Cancel</i> and <i>Send</i> buttons, which allow them to manage their submission.	Presenter <ul style="list-style-type: none">Sees the questions in a Qboard overview: a grid of cards containing all submissions.Can filter by “This slide” or “All slides”.Can open Qboard at any time via the Qboard icon in the top right corner of the presentation screen.

Turning Qboard on and off per project

When you create a new QandR project, you can turn Qboard on **for the first slide (in the editor)** using the option: “**Qboard questions: on/off**”



Set Qboard as the default for every project

If you always want to allow questions and comments while showing your slides, you can enable Qboard in your **user profile** using the option: “**Default Qboard setting: on/off**”
